HEALTH INFORMATION MANAGEMENT TECHNOLOGY PROGRAM  
GENERAL APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS**

Applicants are encouraged to meet with the Director of Admissions or a college health technology counselor regarding admission criteria.

Applicants must have the following requirements completed before they can be considered for admission into the Health Information Management Technology Program (HIMT):

- An application for admission (\$15 fee),
- An official copy of high school transcript or GED certificate forwarded to The Admissions Office,
- Transfer students should also submit official transcripts of all colleges and universities attended.
- Completion of Nursing and Allied Health Technologies admission requirements Option 1 or Option 2

High school seniors should apply early in their senior year and must also forward a copy of their ACT or SAT scores to the Admissions Office.

**SELECTION PROCESS FOR ADMISSION TO THE HIMT PROGRAM**

Students who wish to enter the Health Information Management Technology Program (HIMT) must meet the criteria of one of the following two options. Applicants who have completed all the requirements for admission will be accepted into the Health Information Management Program on a space-available basis. If completion of the criteria occurs after the incoming class is filled, students will be admitted into the next available class.

All applicants are required to submit a Nursing and Allied Health Technologies Admissions Application to the Admissions Office **upon completion of pre-requisite requirements**. Failure to do so may delay acceptance into the program.

**OPTION 1 - HIGH SCHOOL OPTION**

This option is for current high school seniors or high school graduates who apply to the program within **two** years of high school graduation. ***Current high school students should submit a Health Technology Admissions form during their senior year.***

- A. A composite score on the American College Test (ACT) of 21 or higher or a combined Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) score of 1400 or higher.
- B. Completion of high school Algebra, Chemistry, and Biology with a “C” grade or better.
- C. An overall high school GPA of 2.5 on a 4.0 scale or equivalent.

Upon successful completion of the above criteria, the applicant will be guaranteed admission to the program when a seat is available. Students must complete HLTH 1210 (Medical Terminology) with a “C” grade or better **prior** to enrolling in their first MLT course.
