

Lakeland Community College Nursing Program
Mandatory Student Health Requirements

The following mandatory student health requirements must be met prior to enrollment in the nursing program. Clinical facilities require documentation of health requirements prior to participation in clinical experiences. Please schedule an appointment with your health care provider now. It is important for you to be aware that the process for Hepatitis B vaccinations and titers takes approximately 8 months to complete. Your enrollment in the Nursing Program will be delayed if these requirements are not met. All of the following requirements must be documented on Lakeland's Nursing Student Health Record Form. Students entering the nursing program in the fall must submit a complete Student Health Record Form by July 1. Students entering in the spring must submit a complete form by Dec.1. Submit forms to:

Physical examination: A physical examination by a primary health care provider is required. This examination may be completed within one year prior to enrollment in the nursing program.

Tuberculosis screening: A two-step Mantoux is required no sooner than 4 -8 weeks prior to enrollment in the nursing program. The two-step Mantoux consists of 2 injections. Each is given at separate times, 1 week apart.

Positive Mantoux TB Reactors must submit a chest X-ray report no sooner than 6 months prior to starting the Nursing Program.

Immunizations: The following immunizations and/or proof of immunity are required.

Hepatitis B: A series of three injections and a titer. It will take 8 months to complete the entire process. If the titer is negative, additional vaccinations are required.

Tetanus Diphtheria Toxoid: Basic Series plus a Tetanus Diphtheria Toxoid booster to reactivate immunity within 10 years of entering the program.

Mumps: A positive antibody titer or vaccination after 1980.

Rubella: A positive antibody titer or a single dose of Rubella vaccine or MMR

Rubeola: A positive antibody titer or a single dose of the Rubeola vaccine

Varicella: A positive antibody titer or 2 doses of the Varicella vaccine

Recommended, but not required:

Polio Vaccine: Basic Series and Booster(s)

Tdap (tetanus, diphtheria, pertussis): Tdap should replace a single dose of Td for adults aged <65 years who have not previously received a dose of Tdap.

MMR: A second dose is recommended for health care providers.
