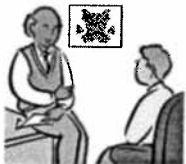


NEW FOR SPRING! HYBRID CRMJ2239/ PRACTICUM/ INTERNSHIP

Thinking of taking CRMJ 2239/Practicum for Spring? Need experience for your career and resume? Opportunities for placement exist with court systems; police and private law enforcement agencies; correction facilities; park systems; and private investigation agencies. The new hybrid CRMJ2239 class will be a combination of hands-on experience, classroom and on-line assignments.

Authorized internship practicum sites include:

- 9 correctional agencies;
- 7 private law enforcement agencies;
- 17 public law enforcement agencies;
- 1 private investigation agency;
- 6 courts;
- 1 community agency;
- 1 county coroner.

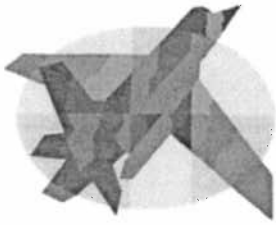
GUEST SPEAKER!

Collectible firearms will be allowed and must meet federal law:

1. Must have been produced 50 years ago or more for the military and during a wartime period. (Wartime periods include 1914 - 1918, 1930 - 1945 and 1950.)
2. All weapons at the show must be made safe (magazine out, bolt the rear, inspected by on-site police officer, and fitted with plastic tie.) **Please bring all weapons into the show in case or sleeve. -NO OTHER FIREARMS - no exceptions!**

MILITARY CREDIT: ATTENTION MILITARY POLICE!

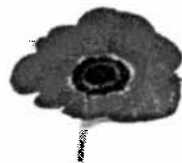
If you have served as a military police officer for any branch of the Federal Government, you may be eligible for credit by experience for 3 hours of technical elective (CRMJ2214/Patrol Operations). You will need a copy of your DD214 for proof of military police service.

- ★ Apply to Lakeland Community College;
- ★ Apply for VA Educational Benefits (visit VONAPP). Locate Form 22-1990 for Veterans (PDF) or Form 22-5490 for Dependents (PDF);
- ★ Request official transcripts from high school and all previously attended colleges;
- ★ Provide a copy of your military or ACE transcripts; Also provide copies of certificates of training;
- ★ Take Compass Placement Test, if necessary;
- ★ Schedule an appointment with a Lakeland counselor to formulate an education plan and evaluate any prior college credit (440-525-7200);
- ★ Submit FAFSA to determine financial aid eligibility;
- ★ Submit the Veterans Registration Reporting Form (PDF) to the Lakeland Veterans Affairs Office EVERY semester to request VA educational funding via VA certification from the Department of Veteran Affairs. Copyright 2011 Lakeland Community College

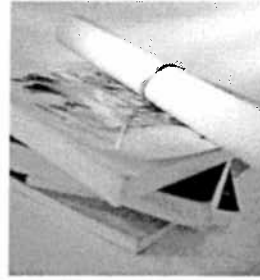
LAKELAND COMMUNITY COLLEGE CAREER EXPO FAIR!

To make the best impression on the employers, job seekers should:

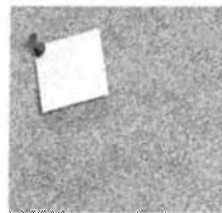
- Dress professionally;

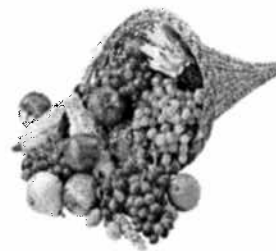
STUDENT HANDBOOK & PLANNER!

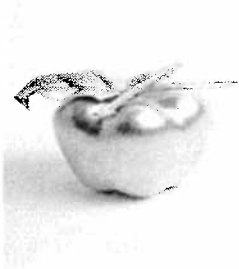

SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES!

Lakeland Community College and The Lakeland Foundation are offering scholarships for the 2011-2012 academic year. To apply for these scholarships you must submit a scholarship application and a 250-word personal statement. Application forms and instructions are available from the Financial Aid Office of Lakeland Community College, A1004c, 440-525-7070.

The Public Service Scholarships are:

George Hayward VFW Post 9295 Scholarship Fund of the Lakeland Foundation.

The scholarship will benefit full-time or part-time students at Lakeland Community College who are enrolled in either credit or not-for-credit courses, maintain a cumulative grade-point average of 2.0 after their first semester of LCC enrollment and are honorably discharged veterans of the U.S. armed forces.

Beall (Margaret "Mickey" Memorial Endowed Scholarship.

Recipients must major in or plan to major in Law Enforcement, Fire Science, Emergency Medical or the Lakeland Police Academy.

Emerald Society Shannon McBride Police Academy Scholarship.

A student who meets and complies with all requirements and is accepted (has passed all qualifying tests) for eligibility into the police academy at Lakeland College.

Government & Public Service Technologies Scholarship.

Those who meet and comply with all admission requirements at Lakeland Community College and are enrolled in a certificate or degree program, and/or non-credit or community education program leading to a career in government or public service.

Lake County Association of Chief of Police Scholarship.

Enrolled in the Criminal Justice or Basic Police Academy.

Todd W. Latz Criminal Justice Memorial Endowment.

Enrolled in the Law Enforcement Criminal Justice program.

Cpl. Joshua S. Harmon Scholarship.

Recipients must major in any of the following areas: Music, Emergency Medical/Paramedic, Fire Science or Criminal Justice. Priority will be given to students in music program.

Andy Nowacki Memorial Scholarship Endowment.

Students who meet and comply with all admission requirements at Lakeland Community College and are enrolled in public service programs such as: Law Enforcement, Police Academy, Criminal Justice, Fire Science, Emergency Medical Technology - (EMT) Paramedics certificates/programs.

Professor & Lake County Commissioner John F. Platz Good Government Scholarship.

Must be interested in political science, history or the public services (police, fire or the human services).
