As a veteran theater professional, Jordan brings his over 25 years of theater experience to every project he works on. He is the founding artistic director for Shining Star CLE, The Passion Project and his work frequents the stages all across Cleveland's diverse theater community. In 2021, he joined the staff of Baldwin Wallace University's acclaimed musical theater program. An Akron native, he is a graduate of Miller South School and Firestone High School's VPA programs and is thrilled to be working with the Lakeland Civic Theatre again. Favorite directorial credits include "She Loves Me," "Children of Eden," "The Drowsy Chaperone," "The Diary of Ann Frank," "Peter Pan" and "A Year With Frog and Toad." His upcoming directorial project is "The Music Man" at Near West Theater.

MARTIN E. FRIEDMAN, PH.D. (Artistic Director/Director/Producer). Martin Friedman has been an adjunct instructor in theater arts and communications at Lakeland Community College since 1998, and at Baldwin Wallace University since 2010, and he recently retired from John Carroll University where he taught theater since 1988.

Last year, Friedman directed his 51st and 52nd productions at Lakeland Civic Theatre which included the local premiere of "Freaky Friday." Most recently Friedman directed two stage readings, "Blithe Spirit" and "The Heidi Chronicles" at Baldwin Wallace University and presented a master class on "Stephen Sondheim and 'Merrily We Roll Along'" for Nighttown's Master Class Series on the Arts in Cleveland Heights, Ohio to great acclaim.

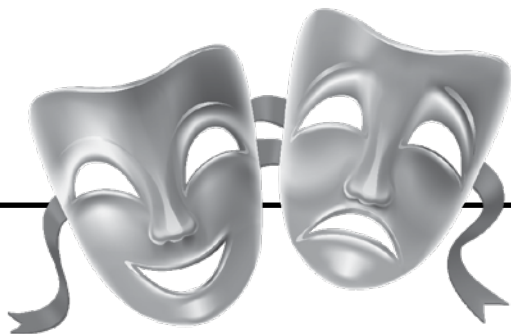
In 2011, Friedman directed the Northeast Ohio premiere of "Dirty Rotten Scoundrels" at the Chagrin Valley Little Theatre and then in 2013, Friedman directed "Prelude to a Kiss" at the Ensemble Theatre, "Sunday in the Park with George," at True North Theatre and Stephen Sondheim and Nathan Lane's "The Frogs" at Cain Park in Cleveland Heights. Friedman holds a B.S. degree in theater education from Emerson College (Boston), an M.A. and a Ph.D. in theater from the University of Michigan (Ann Arbor), and a certificate in nonprofit management from Case Western Reserve University's Mandel School of Non-Profit Organizations. Over the last 22 years, Friedman has been the artistic director of a children's theater camp for the city of Shaker Heights. And finally, as a communications consultant, Friedman has worked with law firms and businesses to improve their communications with employees and the public, and to develop diversity programs using theatrical scenarios.

JEFFERY VAN CURTIS (Costume Designer) Curtis has worked for Cleveland Play House (CPH) since 1994 and in 1999, he became the costume shop supervisor. In addition to being the costume shop supervisor he has designed costumes for several CPH productions including "A Carol for Cleveland," "My Name is Asher Lev," "Bill W. and Dr. Bob," "Doubt," "I Am My Own Wife," "Rounding Third," "Proof," and "Dinner with Friends and Art." Curtis has also designed several shows for the Case Western Reserve University/Cleveland Play House MFA acting program which include "A Philadelphia Story," "Twelfth Night," "Angels in America; Millennium Approaches," "The Winter's Tale," "An Orchard," "All's Well That Ends Well." Other design credits include "Singin' on the Ohio" and "The Goblins will Git You" for Lantern Theatre and several CPH children shows. He has also designed productions for Coconut Grove Playhouse, Studio Arena Theatre and Music Theatre North. In addition, he designed wigs for a number of CPH and Lyric Opera of Cleveland productions and worked on the film Kansas City. Curtis has a Master of Fine Arts in costume design and technology from University of Missouri-Kansas City and thanks Jordan Cooper for this opportunity and the CPH staff for their support.

TIMOTHY DORMAN (Lakeland PAC Technical Coordinator): Dorman has only recently joined the Lakeland Civic Theatre team. In his past lives, he has worked backstage and performed in dozens of small community theater productions mostly around NE Ohio. He actually played the part of Lee Harvey Oswald many years ago in another production of ASSASSINS. He has worked as an ETCP* certified stage electrician in and around Playhouse Square, Rocket Mortgage Fieldhouse, Terminal Tower and many other venues in the Cleveland area. One of his favorite hobbies is bending restaurant and cafeteria silverware into indistinguishable shapes that are meant to resemble spiders and other small crawling things. Dorman is extremely happy to be working with the director, cast and crew in this incredible show.

Production Notes

MICHAEL FRAYN (Playwright) A novelist and playwright, Mr. Frayn has been successful at both endeavors. Born in London, England in 1933, his plays include "Noises Off" (1982), "Clouds" (1976) and "Benefactors" (1984). "Copenhagen" (1998), about the 1941 meeting between German physicist Werner Heisenberg and his Danish counterpart Niels Bohr, first staged at the Royal National Theatre in London, won the 1998 Evening Standard Award for Best Play of the Year and the 2000 Tony Award for Best Play (USA). His play "Democracy" (2003), is set in 1960s Berlin. His latest play for the Royal National Theatre is "Afterlife" (2008).

Frayn has also translated a number of works from Russian, including plays by Chekhov and Tolstoy. His films for television include "First and Last" (1989), for which he won an Emmy, and an adaptation of his 1991 novel "A Landing on the Sun." He also wrote the screenplay for the film "Clockwise" (1986), a comedy starring John Cleese. Michael Frayn is married to the biographer and critic Claire Toma.
