## COMMENCEMENT SPEAKER

**K. MICHAEL BENZ**, Executive Advisor at Ciuni & Panichi, Inc. Former President and CEO of the United Way of Greater Cleveland, and Executive-in-Residence for Lakeland Community College

K. Michael Benz, executive advisor at Ciuni & Panichi, Inc., provides strategic planning and business development expertise to the client service menu and the firm's leadership team. In addition to his work at Ciuni & Panichi, Inc., he serves as Fifth Third Bank Affiliate director, Northeastern Ohio; ReCreation Partners, LLC, vice chairperson; and Executive-In-Residence for Lakeland Community College.

He was United Way of Greater Cleveland president and CEO for 17-plus years. Under his leadership, United Way raised more than \$732 million to fund health and human services in the Greater Cleveland community. Also under Benz's leadership, United Way implemented one of the most innovative public art projects, GuitarMania®, raising over \$2 million and attracting national and international acclaim. Benz also is known for operating a very tight ship, and he has kept administrative expenses under 13%, which is less than many other nonprofits, including other United Ways around the country.

In addition to raising funds for Cleveland, Benz invested as much energy to ensure United Way's investments were sound. In 2008, under his leadership, United Way implemented a new approach to funding programs that is heavily grounded in research and designed to move the needle on the community's problems.

Prior to the United Way, Benz provided 24 years of service to the Greater Cleveland Growth Association; 12 years as the organization's executive vice president and eight years as the director of the Council of Smaller Enterprises (COSE).

Benz retired from United Way in 2012 and joined Ciuni & Panichi, Inc. as an executive advisor counseling clients on board engagement, leadership, fundraising strategies and a wide variety of consulting assignments.

He currently serves on the Cleveland Clinic board of directors and the Leadership Center board of directors and Executive Committee. He also chairs the South Pointe Hospital board of directors – a Cleveland Clinic Hospital.

Among his many awards and honors, Benz has served as the Cuyahoga County Community College Foundation master of ceremonies for their Presidential Scholarship Luncheon. In that role, he introduced President Bill Clinton, President George W. Bush and Magic Johnson. He has been inducted into the Wickliffe High School Hall of Fame and the Wickliffe City Hall of Fame for Achievement. He was recognized as SME Businessman of the Year, and he received the Gordon E. Heffern Lifetime Award for Ethics, Values and Community. He was awarded the Key to the City by Cleveland Mayor Frank Jackson.

Benz is a Clevelander, and now a Laker, and his work reflects his passion for this community. He was instrumental in bringing the Rock & Roll Hall of Fame and Museum to Cleveland and served as the museum's director.

## RECIPIENTS OF THE DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD TO A MEMBER OF THE COMMUNITY

**CYNTHIA MOORE-HARDY**, Former President of University Hospitals Lake Health

After dedicating most of her career to strengthening and improving the health of the Lake County community, Cynthia Moore-Hardy, FACHE, and former president of UH Lake Health, now serves in a consulting capacity at UH.

As president and CEO of Lake Health for 25 years prior to the integration into University Hospitals, Moore-Hardy was instrumental in helping to grow and transform Lake Health into a fully integrated health care system with 11 facilities, including three acute care hospitals.

As a leading voice for health care who always emphasized quality, safety, caregiver engagement and operational efficiency, Moore-Hardy helped cement Lake Health as one of the premier independent health systems in Ohio. Throughout her tenure, Moore-Hardy oversaw major capital investment including the opening of TriPoint Medical Center and Beachwood Medical Center, the Lake Continuing Care Center, as well as several outpatient health centers that spanned three counties.

Moore-Hardy always believed that collaboration moved health care forward in the community, and that required forming partnerships to improve access and outcomes. During her tenure, Moore-Hardy was instrumental in partnering with physicians to create the Lake Health Physician Group and the Integrated Physician Hospital Enterprise, with University Hospitals for cancer care and open-heart surgery, and with community organizations like our schools and Beacon Health to provide primary care clinics.

Moore-Hardy's contributions to health care extend far beyond her community. She currently serves on the Ohio Hospital Association (OHA) Institute for Health Innovation Board and is a past chair of the OHA Board. And in 2020, she served as co-chair of the Ohio Hospital Association Diversity & Equity Task Force. She is a former alternate delegate to the American Hospital Association's Regional Policy Board (Region 5), and a past board chair and trustee of the Center for Health Affairs in Cleveland. Moore-Hardy also serves on numerous local boards, including the Greater Cleveland Food Bank, the Cleveland Chapter of the Alzheimer's Association, Holden Forests & Gardens and Ursuline College.

As a true advocate for health care, Moore-Hardy has earned statewide and national recognition for her accomplishments. She was a recipient of the 2017 OHA James R. Castle Distinguished Service Award and The Ohio State University College of Nursing Distinguished Alumna Award and was inducted into the Northeast Ohio Business Hall of Fame in 2016. She was also recognized on Becker's Hospital Review 2018 annual list of "143 Women Hospital and Health Care Leaders You Need to Know," as one of Modern health care's "Top 25 Minority Executives in health care" and as a "Distinguished Woman in Health Care" by the Visiting Nurses Association (VNA).

Moore-Hardy's career began as a critical care nurse at St. Luke's Hospital in Cleveland before joining Lake Health in 1988 as assistant administrator, Cardiology Services. She quickly ascended through the administrative ranks and became president and CEO of Lake Health in 1997. Moore-Hardy received her bachelor's degree in nursing from The Ohio State University and her master's degree in business administration from Cleveland State University.

## The Arms of Lakeland Community College

Arms approved by the Board of Trustees  
and assumed Friday, 20th, October, 1967.

**BLAZON:** (description in heraldic terms)

Per fess Azure and Argent, in chief two  
open books of the last and in base three  
barrulets wavy of the first.

College colors: Blue and silver

## SIGNIFICANCE

In non-heraldic language, the arms of Lakeland Community College may be described as a shield divided across the middle—known in heraldry as “per fess”—with the upper portion being blue and the lower portion silver (white may be substituted). In the upper part of the shield—known in heraldry as the “chief”—are placed two open books completely in silver. In the lower part of the shield are three narrow wavy bars—known in heraldry as “three barrulets wavy.”

The Arms of Lakeland Community College are known in heraldry as canting or “arms parlantes”; they sing or play upon the name. The division across the middle of the shield and the three narrow wavy bars in blue in the base, cant or sing upon the name Lakeland (the land being a deposit from the lake).

The two open books in silver in the upper part of the shield symbolize the arts and sciences. Both branches of learning are dependent upon the written word which is generally transmitted by means of books.

These Arms were designed by A.W.C. Phelps, Fellow of The American Society of Heraldry, member of The Heraldry Society (London) England, on Thursday, 11th May, 1967.

## **LAKELAND COMMUNITY COLLEGE: A COMMUNITY HISTORY**

The history of Lakeland Community College is one in which “community” has been the operative word. Conceived in 1964 by a group of 22 Lake County citizens, the college has grown considerably while serving the educational needs of more than 250,000 people. The goal of the college has remained constant: to offer a comprehensive two-year college transfer program, to provide technical and paraprofessional programs, to provide general education, and to provide professional educational counseling. In addition, Lakeland has responded to the needs of the community by offering numerous programs ranging from specific industry-generated requests, to professional development courses. Today nearly 8,000 individuals attend Lakeland each year in credit and noncredit programs.

Lakeland Community College was the first college in Ohio created by the vote of the people. Twenty-two Lake County citizens provided the impetus for establishing a community college in Lake County by petitioning the board of commissioners. The petition led to the generation of a feasibility study, which recommended that the “creation of a community college district” be a serious consideration. Anxious to move forward, the League of Women Voters began a petition drive in 1965 to place the issue before Lake County voters. On Nov. 2, 1965, Lake County voters approved the issue by a narrow margin. The State of Ohio further supported the movement in 1966 by authorizing the creation of a community college, and that year a board of trustees was appointed. On May 2, 1967, the citizens of Lake County approved a 1.7 mill levy, thereby giving final approval to the opening and operating of a community college district.

When Lakeland opened its doors in September of 1967, the first group of 1,073 students attended classes that were scattered around Painesville in various facilities. These included the Cleveland Trust Building, the YMCA, a Mill Street location, and the Painesville Methodist Church. The administration was housed in an abandoned mortuary home. The college eventually purchased approximately 400 acres belonging to the Edward W. Moore estate to house the permanent site of the college. In the summer of 1971, the college moved to its present site and the dream of 22 citizens took on a reality few could have imagined in those early organizational meetings of 1964.

From humble beginnings to a state-of-the-art campus, the college has been guided by five presidents – Dr. Wayne L. Rodehorst (1967-1981); Willis P. Kern (1977); Dr. James L. Catanzaro (1981-1987); Dr. Ralph R. Doty (1988-2001); and Dr. Morris W. Beverage Jr. (2001-present). They led the college as it expanded in its physical size and the programs and services it offers. The college now encompasses 10 buildings on the campus. The beautiful and historic Mooreland Mansion, the main house on the Moore estate, underwent an extensive restoration and now serves as an elegant conference center and reception site. The number of faculty and staff has also increased since the college’s inception, so that Lakeland now employs approximately 1,000 people.

Since 1967, the number of classes and programs of study have grown substantially. Lakeland now offers over 1,100 credit courses, 78 degrees, 64 certificates, and transfer modules that provide transferable credits to other colleges and universities located all over the country. Students can take classes at the campus location, through online courses, in an accelerated format, or as high school students in the College Credit Plus or the Tech Prep Program. The Holden University Center of Lakeland opened in the fall of 2011 to offer convenient access to complete a bachelor’s or graduate degree from a variety of leading colleges and universities. Lakeland promotes lifelong learning for people of all ages, from summer camps for children to free credit classes for senior adults. Noncredit professional development courses are offered to learn new skills.

Culturally, Lakeland has become a focal point of high-quality regional arts and lecture presentations. The college hosts professional theater productions, concerts, and art shows that are housed in one of the largest galleries in Northeastern Ohio. Lakeland is the home to noted music and art competitions that draw artists from around the nation. Also, a variety of annual lecture series and symposia address important political, economic, environmental and educational issues affecting area citizens.

The expansion of the college in terms of its physical size, number of employees and programs offered has been impressive since its inception in 1967. New programs are created almost yearly to meet the needs of an ever-changing society, economy and workforce. Residents of Lake County support the college through two operating levies and a capital improvement bond issue that keep Lakeland always working for Lake County. For more than 50 years, Lakeland Community College has served generations of Northeast Ohioans, and as it continues to grow, will remain true to its original guiding principle: to serve the community.

## ACADEMIC REGALIA

The history of academic costume dates from medieval days when university students wore woolen and fur garments for warmth in damp and drafty buildings. Most of those studying were clerics in the holy orders; they wore a cloak to which was attached a hood that could be pulled up to cover their tonsured heads. Simplified today, the costume serves to remind us that its wearer is a member of an ancient and venerable profession; it also indicates by its color and design its wearer's degree and the institution by which the degree was conferred.

In the United States, black has been the traditional color for academic gowns, but some institutions authorize holders of their doctorates to wear the colors of the institution. The associate's gown and the bachelor's gown, which are black in color, are distinguished by their long, open sleeves; the master's by its closed, slitted sleeves; the doctor's by its full sleeves trimmed with bands of velvet, which may be black or a color denoting the field in which the degree was taken.

The mortarboard cap, proper for all degrees, is black. Tassels are worn over the left front quarter of the cap. Holders of the doctorate may wear tassels of gold thread.

Academic hoods vary in length according to the degree and are lined with the colors of the institution by which the degree was granted. The hood is trimmed with velvet in a color that indicates the field in which the degree was taken. Colors associated with some of the various disciplines are: Arts and Letters, white; Business, drab; Education, light blue; Engineering, orange; Fine Arts, brown; Law, purple; Library Science, lemon; Medicine, green; Music, pink; Philosophy, dark blue; Physical Education, sage green; Science, golden yellow; Theology, scarlet.

The ceremonial mace, which is carried by the lead faculty member in the procession, signifies highest honors bestowed upon a distinguished faculty member by his/her professional colleagues.

Lakeland graduates wear tassels that correspond to their degree program. Tassel colors are listed below by program degree.

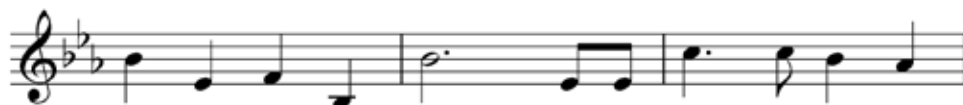
