Red Light Roxy embodies the spirit of swinging jazz and blues from the 1930 through the '60s with an eclectic mix of jazz standards, jump blues, swing, boogie-woogie, Latin jazz and more. Its repertoire comes from the Great American Songbook and includes familiar songs made famous by such legendary performers as Ella Fitzgerald, Ruth Brown, Frank Sinatra, Peggy Lee, Ray Charles and Louis Jordan.

The Group features vocalist Eileen Burns who toured as a featured vocalist with the world-renowned Glenn Miller Orchestra all over the United States, Canada, and Japan. She is also an original cast member of the Midnight Martini Show at Cleveland's own Pickwick and Frolic.

Pianist Joe Hunter is very popular Northeast Ohio artist having released three albums under his own name including his most recent album "Sweet and Lovely". As an accomplished jazz educator, he taught at the TRI-C metro jazz studies program from 1997-2019. Joe is also a recipient of the prestigious 2019 "Cleveland Jazz Legend" award from the Tri-C JazzFest.


Saxophonist and Cuyahoga Community College faculty member Dave Sterner has performed with a variety of local and national acts and has recorded two albums under his own name as well as albums with N. Glenn Davis and Ernie Krivda. He was the director for the Lakeland Civic Jazz Orchestra and the Lakeland Jazz Festival from 2008-2020.

Bassist Demetrius Steinmetz has been part of the jazz studies faculty at Cuyahoga Community College since 2003, teaching ensembles, bass, piano, and saxophone. Demetrius is an instructor for the Amistad Caribbean Arts Camp, the Boys and Girls Club, and the Cleveland Jazz Orchestra's educational outreach program. He performs regularly throughout Northeast Ohio, and has shared the stage with nationally known artists such as Jimmy Heath, Wayne Newton, the Glenn Miller Orchestra, Kim Nazarian, Doug Lawrence, Chico Hamilton, and Carl Allen.

Touring and recording artist Daris Adkins, is a highly in-demand guitarist. In addition to Red Light Roxy, he can be found performing locally with Mike Petrone.

The newest member of the band, Holbrook Riles III, has also toured with the Glenn Miller Orchestra in addition to being a staff musician for several cruise lines. He leads several projects of his own including Free Black and HR3.

#### Diego Figueiredo • Nellie McKay



#### **Diego Figueiredo**

Brazilian guitarist Diego Figueiredo (pronounced "fig-a-ray-doe") lives in, with and for the music. Some people are simply meant to be musicians. Diego is one. He was born in 1980 in Franca, São Paulo State, and began playing music at four-years old. By the age of 12, he had already attracted a local following, and when he was 15, he was drawing huge crowds around Brazil.

Now, in 2022, he has conquered the world. Diego has recorded over two dozen albums, both solo and in collaboration with others, and constantly tours all over the globe. He can no longer be downplayed as a "rising star" among the world's great (jazz) guitarists – he is now inarguably among the established elite. His skills on his instrument are matched only by his ability to move freely between styles, and his sublime technique is paired with an exquisite ability to vary his playing so that it radiates with unwavering excitement. His expressive voice on the acoustic guitar draws inspiration from his home country's rich musical heritage, but he also has a deep knowledge and sense of jazz's quirkiness as well as the classic guitar tradition. Diego Figueiredo can play whatever he desires.

Diego has released 25 CDs between his releases in Brazil, the European label Stunt Records, and now Arbors Records. He has played in more than 60 countries. He is the winner of several important competitions including The Montreux Jazz Guitar Competition, and Brazil's VISA Prize.

Diego has recorded and performed with Brazil's biggest stars including Gilberto Gil, João Bosco, Roberto Menescal, Toquinho, Fafá de Belém, Angela Maria, Toninho Horta, and several years touring the world accompanying Brazil's beloved composer and vocalist, Belchior.

For the last 10 years, Diego has spent large swarths of time in North America, performing solo and in duos with the likes of Larry Coryell, Ken Peplowski, John Clayton, Jeff Hamilton, Chuchito Valdes, Stanley Jordan and Cyrille Aimée.

I don't even know what else to say. Seemingly effortless and thoroughly fabulous."

#### **Nellie McKay**

Nellie McKay has released seven acclaimed albums, starting with "Get Away From Me" ("a tour de force" – The New York Times), including "Normal As Blueberry Pie: A Tribute to Doris Day" ("among the killer overhauls of American standards" – The New York Times) and "My Weekly Reader," music of the '60s ("..kicks serious butt. The results are beautiful." – PopMatters), her second collaboration with famed Beatles engineer Geoff Emerick. On "Obligatory Villagers" ("a brisk nine-song set that plays like the breathless first act of a stage musical decrying American fascism" – SPIN), local Poconos hometown jazz greats Bob Dorough, Phil Woods and David Liebman contributed their exceptional talents.

She has won a Theatre World Award for her portrayal of Polly Peachum on Broadway in "The Threepenny Opera," performed onscreen in the films "P.S. I Love You" and "Downtown Express," and her music was used in "Rumor Has It," "Monster-in-Law," "P.S. I Love You," "Gasland," "Last Holiday" and "Private Life."

McKay co-created and starred in the award-winning off-Broadway hit "Old Hats" and has written three acclaimed musical biographies – "I Want to Live!," the story of Barbara Graham, third woman executed in the gas chamber at San Quentin, "Silent Spring: It's Not Nice to Fool Mother Nature," an exploration of environmental pioneer Rachel Carson, and "A GIRL NAMED BILL – The Life and Times of Billy Tipton," named one of

the Best Concerts of 2014 by "The New York Times." Her latest lady bio is "The Big Molinsky – Considering Joan Rivers" ("unpredictable, thrilling... sardonic wit." – The New York Times).

Nellie's music has been heard on "Mad Men," "Boardwalk Empire," "Weeds," "Grey's Anatomy," "NCIS", "Nurse Jackie" and "SMILF," and she has appeared on TV shows including "The Late Show with David Letterman," "Conan," "Ferguson" and "The View." Nellie has made numerous radio appearances on NPR's "Mountain Stage," "A Prairie Home Companion," "eTown," and "Marion McPartland's Piano Jaz.". The Chase Brock Experience produced a ballet of her third album, "Obligatory Villagers," and she contributed the forward to the 20th anniversary edition of "The Sexual Politics of Meat." Her writing has also appeared in "The Onion," "Interview" and "The New York Times Book Review."

A recipient of PETA's Humanitarian Award and the Humane Society's Doris Day Music Award in recognition of her dedication to animal rights, Nellie is an annoyingly vocal advocate for feminism, civil rights and other deeply felt progressive ideals. She is currently part of the campaign to get horse-drawn carriages off the streets of New York City. She would like to be friends with Russia, the country with the most nuclear weapons in the world. We must all be very kind to one another.

#### **Biographies**



**EDWARD G. MICHAELS**, Festival Coordinator and Interim Director of The Lakeland Jazz Orchestra

Over the years, Ed Michaels has established himself as a strong voice in the field of music education and saxophone performance. He is well known for his leadership in directing the annual Lakeland Community College Jazz Festival; directing Lakeland's all-star high school jazz ensemble - Jazz Impact; and most recently serving as interim director of Lakeland's Civic Jazz Orchestra.

Mr. Michaels earned his Bachelor of Science Degree in Music Education from Duquesne University, in his native Pittsburgh, PA.; and a Master of Music Degree

from Northwestern University, in Evanston, IL., where he studied saxophone with the legendary Dr. Fred Hemke. Ed studied improvisation with Phil Rizzo, a clinician for the Stan Kenton Jazz Orchestra.

As a tenor saxophonist, Ed is often heard performing with the top musicians of Northeast Ohio, among them, some of his former students. He has recorded a CD as leader, entitled Going Beyond on the Nice Jazz Label. The list of musicians with whom Ed has performed includes Phil Woods; Donald Byrd; Pacquito D'Rivera; Bobby Sanabria; and Clarence Cleamons. His quartet has played extended engagements at the Century Room of Cleveland's prestigious Ritz-Carlton Hotel, the Grille Room of downtown Cleveland's Embassy Suites Hotel, Cleveland's Fat Fish Blue, and Club Isabella. Whatever the venue, Ed feels a strong commitment to promoting jazz and American music; and this can especially be seen in Ed's love for both teaching and playing.



#### DR. STEPHEN STANZIANO. Festival Coordinator

Steve Stanziano is a composer, educator, and bassist and holds a Ph.D. in music theory and composition from Kent State University. His works have been performed throughout the United States and Europe including St. Peters Basilica in Rome by the Cleveland Chamber Collective, the Panoramicos, guitarist Jason Vieaux, and members of the Cleveland Orchestra. He is a member of ASCAP and the past president of the Cleveland Composers Guild. He is currently on the music faculty of Cleveland

State University, Lakeland Community College and Hiram College.

#### **BOBBY SELVAGGIO**, Director of The Kent State University Jazz Orchestra

Bobby Selvaggio is one of the leading alto saxophone voices on today's jazz scene. In the words of pianist Kenny Werner, "Bobby is among the best of players out there," and legendary saxophonist Joe Lovano praises Bobby by calling him "one of the few young saxophonists on the scene today that captures you with his strong presence, focus, and sound."

Bobby, who grew up in the Cleveland area, earned his Bachelor of Music in music performance from Kent State University. He eventually moved to New York City and earned a master's degree in jazz performance from the Manhattan School of Music. While in New York, Bobby studied with Joe Lovano, Bobby Watson, Dick Oatts and Maria Schneider.

After living in New York City and gigging around town at places like the Vanguard, Smalls and Birdland for four years, Bobby decided to move back to Cleveland with his family. Northeast Ohio has become his home base of operations where Bobby has toured extensively throughout the U.S. and Canada with various working ensembles and musicians. He has dedicated himself to keeping jazz alive in Cleveland and his passion for jazz education has led him to serve as director of jazz studies at Kent State University.

In addition to his work in jazz education, Bobby continues to expand his discography. His most recent recording is "Live From the Bop Stop" (Dot Time Records, 2020) and features a jazz quartet and wind/brass quartet. As said by "Downbeat" (receiving 3 ½ stars): "The appeal of Selvaggio's work stems as much from his dexterous playing as his clean writing". "Quantum Man" (Dot Time Records, 2016) features a jazz quartet, string guintet, voice and percussion. As said by "Downbeat" (receiving 4 ½ stars): "Even at its most abstract, the highly textured, refreshingly unpredictable Quantum Man is persuasive and moving". "Quantum Man" was also chosen "Best of 2017" by "Downbeat." Follows is "Short Stories" (Origin Records, 2014) featuring Aaron Goldberg on the piano, "Way of Being" (Arabesque Records, 2013), "Grass Roots Movement" (Arabesque Records, 2011) featuring guitarist Nir Felder, "Modern Times" (Arabesque Records, 2009) featuring Kenny Werner on piano and Sean Jones on trumpet, and "Unspoken Dialogue" (Playscape Recordings, 2007) featuring Kenny Werner, as well as Jamey Haddad on drums, Ben Street on bass, and Paul Tynan on trumpet; all musicians Bobby has actively performed and recorded with over the last 25 years.

In addition to playing alto saxophone, Bobby also plays soprano saxophone, alto clarinet, flute, and is a composer, arranger, and jazz clinician. Bobby Selvaggio is an Eastman Saxophone Artist and a Jody Jazz Mouthpiece endorser.

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

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
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
