**Full Description** 

Recycling unwanted crayons into unlimited possibilities. Donate your unwanted crayons and The Crayon Initiative will recycle old crayons into new ones and donate them back to schools, hospitals, arts programs and other organizations. The wax from crayons is not biodegradable and will never break down, leaving a waxy sludge in our landfills for centuries to come. The Crayon Initiative supports environmental efforts by diverting crayons from the landfills. The Crayon Initiative donates to Northeast Ohio hospitals. The project will be embedded into the BUSM1300 course work. (Connie Golden) Students will work in small groups to create and distribute boxes and collect donated crayons.
