ANNE L. LUKAS, J.D. grew up with stories of wartime hardships and family loss from her father. She has been active with a local organization for children of survivors for the past 24 years, mostly organizing community educational programs. After earning a B.F.A. from Ohio University in Theatre and English Literature and a law degree at Cleveland Marshall College of Law, she founded the Paralegal Studies Program at Notre Dame College. She began teaching a course on the Holocaust in 1998, and recently was named "Facilitator (teacher) of the Year" for 2008. She spent three years as director of the Legal Studies Program and since 2006, has been Director of the Ursuline College Accelerated Program. In June 2006, she led a group of 24 Christians and Jews on an unforgettable experience on the Holocaust Journey through Poland, Italy and Israel. Anne will introduce the evening screening of "Being Jewish in France" the last film of the Tournées Film Festival on Thursday, October 29 at 7:00 p.m. in H-101.
