

Jury Duty

Courts regularly mail out Jury Duty Summons from a list of potential jurors over age 18 compiled from registered voters and valid drivers license holders in their jurisdiction. If jurors fail to respond to the Summons, agents of the local courts will call prospective jurors with notification that they have missed a call for jury duty. They have authorization to issue a warrant for the juror's arrest unless they can prove they have not received notification. The agents may ask for personal information to confirm that the person is not on their list of "skipped" jurors who have failed to either appear in court or to provide a sufficient excuse for non-attendance.
