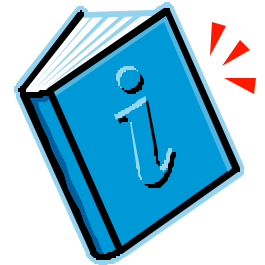


Information Literacy Instruction Continues to Rise

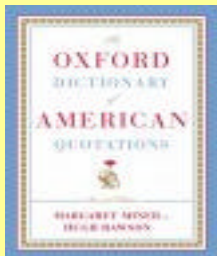
Fall Semester Library Statistics

- 91,888 people walked through the library doors
- 155 information literacy classes were taught reaching 2,677 students
- Several thousand electronic books were added for a total of 6,041
- Total collection size: 57,622 items
- 10,776 items were checked out
- 1461 Interlibrary loan requests were provided to other libraries
- 2359 Interlibrary loan requests were received from other libraries
- 4989 reference questions were asked

Reference Print Collection Moving Towards Digital

Lakeland library's print reference collection is currently being reviewed to determine what is being used, what can be dropped and what in print is now available electronically. Where possible, print copies are being replaced with electronic resources. This is being done for several reasons. First, because we are running out of space, and second, because electronic versions are available from anywhere, anytime. When we stop receiving something in print because it is now available on the web, the print copy is removed from the collection, and the URL is being added to the catalog record so you can still find it easily.

Currently, there are more than 6,000 electronic books linked in the library catalog. You can limit a catalog search to the material type "ebooks," or simply examine the list of ebooks linked from the left side of the library's homepage.
