

What is College Credit Plus?

College Credit Plus is Ohio's dual enrollment program where students earn both high school and college credit at the same time

- Students may apply to any public or participating private college
- Students may apply and take courses at multiple colleges



Who's Eligible?

- Students in grades 7-12
- Ohio residents
- Students who meet academic eligibility standards (*determined by the State*)
- Students who meet the admissions requirements for the college/university (*may be different for each college*)
- Students who are “College Ready”
- Male students who are at least 18 years of age are required to be registered with the Selective Service

What does it mean to be “College-Ready”?

More than just academically ready

- Emotional and social transition
- Meeting college expectations
- Time management and organizational skills
- Some college classes have content that is oriented toward a mature or adult student. College instructors will not modify the course content for CCP students.
 - Ohio requires new CCP students & parents to complete a Mature Content Permission Slip

FERPA

- The “Family Education Rights and Privacy Act” (FERPA)
 - Protects student education records
 - Parents do not have access to student’s academic records
 - Colleges reserve the right to communicate student record information with appropriate high school officials who have an “educational need to know”
 - “Permission to Release Information Form” – students written consent to share information with a third party
 - *This will give parents a limited access to their student’s records*

Benefits of CCP

- Students can:
 - Earn high school & college credits at the same time
 - Get a “head start” on career plans
 - Start & potentially complete a degree or certificate program
 - Understand the expectations of college life
 - Save tuition & textbook costs
 - Have more class opportunities & a flexible schedule

Intent to Participate Form

- Students must complete the Intent to Participate form and submit it to their high school by **April 1**, for the upcoming academic year
- This is the only way CCP students can receive state funding
- Not a binding contract & students can decide not to participate even if they sign it.
- This form is separate than the college application
- Some expenses are not covered (Ex: parking, transportation, calculators, optional materials, etc.)
- On the Intent to Participate form, students indicate a tentative plan to use Option A or Option B for payment of the College Credit Plus courses

Option A	Option B
<ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ The family/student will “self pay” for college course at the standard rate of tuition, fees, and textbooks▪ Students can choose to earn college credit and high school credit OR only college credit (students must inform the high school of their choice of credit for courses)	<ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ “Default” or standard option for CCP▪ All college course tuition, fees, and textbooks will be paid for by the state of Ohio (supported by the school’s foundation funds and the college’s funds)▪ Students will earn college credit and high school credit▪ Private colleges may charge students a small fee per credit hour

How Many Credits Can Students Take?

- Up to 30 credits per academic year, includes high school classes:
 - Calculation: $30 - (\text{ ____ } \text{ high school units} \times 3) = \text{ ____ }$ (max CCP credits)
 - Example: $30 - (3 \text{ high school units} \times 3) = \mathbf{21}$ CCP credits
- College classes can range from 1 to 5 credits
- If a student enrolls in more than 30 credits, they can either:
 - Drop the course (during the 100% refund period) or
 - Pay for the entire course (including tuition, fees, books) at the college's standard rates
- Lifetime maximum credits per student is 120

What Courses can Students Take?

- Students must meet prerequisites for all courses they take.
- Students must complete their first 15 credits in Level I courses
 - *These are transferable to public Ohio universities*
 - *See College/University's website for a list of Level I courses*
- Students can take courses that:
 - Fulfill high school graduation requirements
 - *Students must work with high school counselors to ensure they are meeting any mandatory testing or other high school requirements*
 - Part of a career pathway that interests them
 - Part of a major or degree requirement

Non-Allowable Courses

- Private applied courses with one-on-one instruction
 - *Example: guitar, piano, etc.*
- Courses with high fees
- Study abroad courses
- Physical education courses
 - *Example: yoga, weight-lifting, etc.*
- Pass/Fail graded courses
- Remedial courses or sectarian/religious courses

Grades & GPA

- CCP grades earned in college courses are the same grades that will appear on the high school transcript
- If a student fails or withdraws from the course, the college transcript and high school transcript will reflect the student's final grade.
- If students do not earn a passing grade or withdraw too late from college courses, the high school may require students/families* to reimburse the tuition that the district paid
- Grades will be factored into the high school and college GPA
- If a high school uses a weighted grading scale for Advanced Placement or Honors courses in a subject area, CCP courses in the same subject area will be weighted using the same scale
- Students must successfully complete the courses in order to earn the credit
- CCP grades/courses stay on the student's college transcript permanently

**If a student is considered "economically disadvantaged", a school may not seek reimbursement*

CCP Probation & Dismissal

Probation	Dismissal
<ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ A student will be placed on CCP Probation if they earn less than a cumulative 2.0 GPA in CCP courses or withdraws from 2 or more courses in one academic term▪ When on CCP Probation, the student may only enroll in one CCP course for one college semester and may not enroll in a college course in the same subject in which they previously earned a D, F, or W grade▪ Appeals*: students may submit an appeal to retake a course	<ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ If a student on CCP Probation does not increase their CCP GPA to a 2.0 or above during the probation semester, they will be placed on CCP Dismissal▪ While on CCP Dismissal, students may not enroll in any CCP courses▪ Appeals*: students may submit an appeal within 5 days of being dismissed, or wait until the end of the CCP Dismissal semester

*Each high school must have a policy describing the process for appeals

What Support Services are Available?

- High school guidance counselor
- College advisors/counselors
- Colleges provide the same academic supports to CCP students as they do traditional students
 - Learning Center/Tutoring
 - Library Access/Research Databases
 - Advising/Counseling
 - Accommodations (*IEP or 504 Plans*)

CCP at Lakeland!

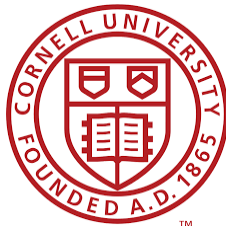

Lakeland Classes Opportunities:

- Lakeland courses can fulfill high school graduation requirements
 - Students must meet the prerequisites for any course they take!
- Lakeland offers classes that are 16-weeks, 12-weeks, or 8-weeks.
- Lakeland offers online, in-person, or hybrid courses
- CCP students have the first **TWO WEEKS** to drop a course at 100% refund, no penalty.
- Writing Center & Tutoring Services
- Honors Program (*available to High School Seniors with a GPA of 3.5 or higher*)

MATH Courses at Lakeland

- CCP students that want to take a "MATH" course at Lakeland still must meet the CCP admission criteria (*previous slide*)
- CCP students must take Algebra 2 at their high school before being eligible for "MATH" courses at Lakeland

Take!

- ❖ REQUIRED - Bring photo ID or College Board Student ID Form
- ❖ Sign up is required online (*must apply to Lakeland first*)
- ❖ Test takes place on Lakeland's campus
- ❖ Not timed
- ❖ Uses computer-adaptive technology (*the response to each question determines the difficulty level of the next question*)
- ❖ Multiple choice
- ❖ Students have 2 attempts to meet the threshold (*a 3rd attempt may be allowed if student participates in a test prep activity*)


Students who utilize test prep resources, on average, improve their score by 8 points on the writing test & 10 points on the math test!

Middle School Students!

- Students entering the 7th, 8th, or 9th grade must take the Accuplacer Writing placement test, and test into college-level English in order to take any course at Lakeland.

Getting Started!

- ❑ **Apply to Lakeland: Quick & Easy 2-step application process!**
 - ❑ **Step 1: Create an account**
 - ❑ Go to www.lakelandcc.edu/apply
 - ❑ Select "Standard Application"
 - ❑ Select "College Credit Plus"
 - ❑ Click "Create Account" & fill out information
 - ❑ You will receive an email with a link to active your account
 - ❑ **Step 2: Log back into the account you just created & submit a CCP application**
 - ❑ Social Security number is required
 - ❑ Be sure to select student type "College Credit Plus Applicant"
 - ❑ When prompted with question "Have you graduated high school?," make sure to select answer "No, I am still currently in high school."
 - ❑ If unsure about "Academic Program" select "Associate of Arts".
 - ❑ If unsure about "Educational Goal" select "Associate Degree for Transfer"
- ❑ Complete the CCP Permission Slip and email it to CCPinfo@lakelandcc.edu
- ❑ Request your high school transcript be sent to Lakeland at CCPinfo@lakelandcc.edu



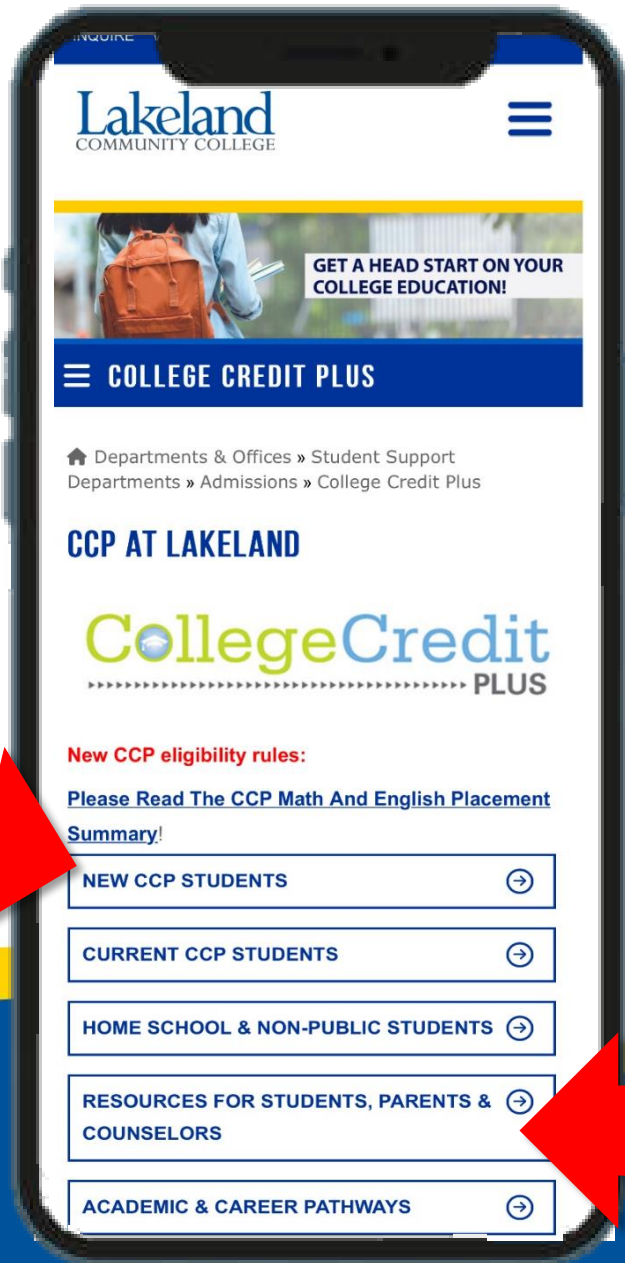
