

High School Options for College Credit

1) Articulation Agreements:

An articulation agreement is an agreement between a career center or career technical planning district, and a college or university. It grants college credit to a student where the material learned in a secondary technical program matches that taught in a college course. Lakeland's articulation agreements are on its website:

2) Credit through CTAG:

Students can obtain college credit for participation in a secondary technical education program when the work done in the secondary program matches a college course. The only difference between articulated credit and CTAG credit is who controls the process. If the college or university controls the process, it is articulated credit. If the state controls the process, it is CTAG credit. CTAG credit has the advantage of acceptance of the credit at any public state college or university*; articulated credit is only guaranteed at a specific college or university. The process for claiming CTAG credit was recently automated through a system called CTAV.
